Course Description

The senior capstone project reflects the culmination of knowledge, skills, and attitudes by senior students in a career pathway of their choosing. The senior project provides a venue for seniors to plan and execute individualized study and project on a topic of particular interest to them. Participants will have their independent project and research periodically assessed by the instructor. Students are to enlist the guidance of an adult mentor from the school or community. The following products are required from the senior participating in a Capstone Project: 1) a research paper to demonstrate information and knowledge acquisition skills, 2) a product to be designed and executed by the student, 3) a formal oral report before a panel, and 4) a portfolio that relates the "learning journey" and verifies the learning process. The topics of interest will be student-driven and the choice of media for presentation will be at the discretion of the student presenter. Prerequisites: Successful completion of mentor-guided internship and Junior Seminar.

Attendance: Senior Seminar is a course that meets once weekly, but that demands a large amount of student-directed work outside of class time. Attendance at weekly class sessions is imperative for assuring students have the guidance necessary for completing their projects successfully. Regular work outside of class is expected for students to have the kind of senior project experience they can be proud of, and that challenges and prepares them for future endeavors. Mandatory project check-ins with Ms. Terry will be scheduled periodically outside of class time, and students are welcome to check-in informally for project guidance at any time throughout the year.

Cell Phones and Responsible Use of Technology: I implement a strict NO CELL PHONE policy in which students must leave their devices in the front of the room. There is a no tolerance policy for irresponsible technology use, students will be blocked per school policy, and disciplinary issues will be immediately referred to administration.
